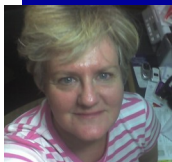
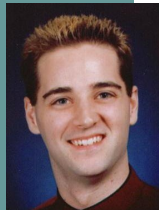


Instructors

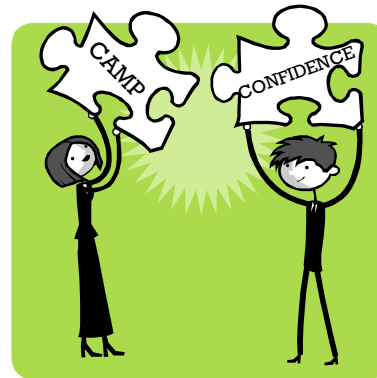

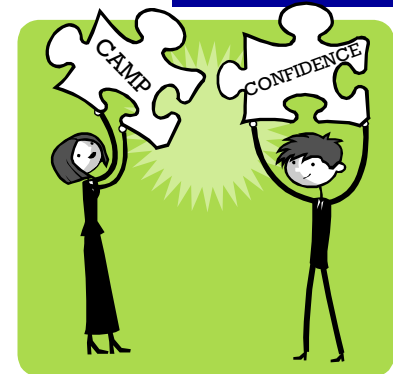

Kids with autism, Asperger Syndrome, and other ASDs know what it’s like to be boo-ed off the stage of life. They often end up playing only minor roles in school, as they scurry about hallways to avoid bullies or slouch in their seats to minimize interaction with other students. Camp Confidence utilizes acting and improvisational methods to teach these youth to feel more confident in every stage of life.

Every child deserves to live life without fear of embarrassment. Camp Confidence will empower your child to show confidence and be treated with respect.

The activities and exercises at Camp Confidence are designed to empower young people on the autism spectrum. It is strategically situated in a school cafeteria, where so many children and adolescents with ASD suffer embarrassment. We will focus on four skills in a sequential, cumulative format: **posture, walking, eye contact, and tone of voice.** Group activities will introduce targeted skills practiced in a safe, formative environment and for application in real-life situations. Parents will receive daily information on how to practice the skills in the home environment for reinforcement, greater generalization, and increased confidence.
